Re: Instant Registration for Pacer

Hello and Happy New Year.

The Bankruptcy Court for the District of North Dakota would like to tell you about a new system called **Instant Registration for Pacer**. See the following link for more details http://pacer.psc.uscourts.gov/announcements/general/instant_reg.pdf

As you know Pacer or **Public Access to Court Electronic Records** is an electronic public access service that allows users to obtain case and docket information from the U.S. Bankruptcy Court for the District of North Dakota.

Most Bankruptcy and District Courts offer an Internet web site with a link to their **PACER** system. Electronic access is available only to users who have registered for this service. The registration is free of charge but often takes up to a week and sometimes longer before your login and password are given to you for access to a court's PACER system.

That system has changed. You can now register for any Pacer system and get your login and password in minutes. Point your browser to www.pacer.uscourts.gov. Fill out the on-line form, provide a valid email address and a credit card number and your account will then be created. Shortly after your registration you will receive email with a link enclosed. This is done for security purposes. Click on the link and you will be given your new login and password.

Other improvements are automatic quarterly billing and on-line password retrieval should you lose or forget your password. The cost is still seven cents for each page viewed.

If you have not registered for the Bankruptcy Courts Pacer system feel free to click on this link and register with the Pacer Service center. If someone you know would like more information on Pacer or the new registration system feel free to forward this email to them.
